4. A ceramic that is only one color.
5. A ceramic that has 2 colors.
6. A ceramic that can hold something (water, tea, coffee, rice /grain, oil, flowers) What do you think it could hold?
7. A ceramic that does not hold something.
8. A ceramic that has people on it.
9. A ceramic that has an animal on it.
10. A ceramic with a handle.
